



Find Your Path Scholarship 2024

Students who do not have any family members that have pursued post-secondary education have been known to experience unique challenges in applying to, matriculating to, and graduating from university and college. These may include practical challenges such as unfamiliarity with the application process and financial barriers as well as psychological challenges such as anxiety about academic and social preparedness. These challenges can greatly deter such students from pursuing post-secondary education. Each year, the Find Your Path Scholarship Program recognizes and supports courageous individuals who have overcome such obstacles and been accepted to an accredited post-secondary institution. Winners of the Find Your Path Scholarship receive a \$500 award and mentorship support from a current university or college student. Preference is given to students who demonstrate academic excellence and have positively contributed to their school and/or local communities.

Eligibility

- Must be a graduating twelfth grade student in a high school located in the Greater Toronto Area
- Must have been accepted to an accredited post-secondary institution (i.e. university or college)
- Must be the first member of family to pursue post-secondary education
- Must demonstrate financial need

Application Requirements:

- The application form below fully completed and signed
- An official transcript of your academic record with school stamp
- Personal Statement (up to 300 words) including:
 - Your academic goals and achievements
 - Description of your community involvement
 - Description of the challenges you faced in pursuing a post-secondary education and how you overcame them
 - o Description of how this scholarship will help address your financial need
- One reference letter from a teacher, administrator, employer, or other adult outside of your family who knows you well
- Scan of parent(s) tax returns/ T4 document
- Optional: Provide proof of residence or identification (e.g. driver's license, school student ID card). Preference given to applicants living or attending school in one of Toronto's 31 Neighbourhood Improvement Areas
